### **CRPPH Contributions to Stakeholder Involvement**

The Committee on Radiation Protection and Public Health has been a pioneer in the area of stakeholder involvement in radiological protection decision making, being the first to organisationally begin discussions within the RP community. In the early 1990s the Committee opened discussions of how stakeholders could and should be involved in decision-making processes. Since then, the CRPPH has worked to gather national experience and case studies to demonstrate the importance of stakeholder input to the acceptability and sustainability of radiological protection decisions. This paper will present the main results of five of the key CRPPH initiatives addressing stakeholder involvement: the CRPPH International Nuclear Emergency Exercises series (INEX); the Villigen workshops; the Committee's Chernobyl-related work; the Science and Values in RP Decision Making workshops; and the CRPPH Stakeholder Involvement for Post Nuclear Emergency Management workshop.
